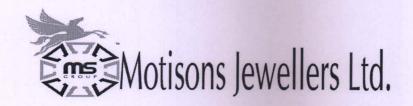

BOARD'S REPORT

To The Members of MOTISONS JEWELLERS LIMITED Jaipur, Rajasthan

Your Directors have pleasure in presenting their **Seventh Annual Report** on the business and operations of the company and the audited statements of accounts for the financial year ended 31st March, 2018.

FINANCIAL HIGHLIGHTS:

The performance of the Company for the financial year ended 31st March, 2018 is summarized as below:

FINANCIAL PERFORMANCE:

During the financial year 2017-2018, Revenue from Operations and other income stood at Rs. 2,08,74,17,587/- as compared to Rs. 2,09,21,45,413/- last year. The Company earned Profit before tax (PBT) of Rs. 4,67,35,938/- as compared to Rs. 4,93,84,458/- last year. The Company achieved Profit after tax (PAT) of Rs. 2,96,78,220/- as compared to Rs. 3,56,58,214/- last year. Basic Earning per share for the year stands at Rs. 0.46/- (P.Y. Rs. 0.55/-) and Diluted Earning per share for the year stands at Rs. 0.40/- (P.Y. Rs. 0.48/-)

Your Company is engaged in the business of manufacturing, sale and trading of gold jewellery, diamond studded jewellery and silver items. Your Company continues to move ahead on its well defined growth path of launching new designs and collections and strengthening in-house designing and manufacturing capabilities. The Company is having in-house designer's team and manufacturing facilities for meeting its requirements.

There have been several measures initiated by the current government to propagate financially transparent measures for purchase of jewellery in the domestic retail segment. Providing PAN numbers of buyers, GST imposition on jewellery etc. are some of the measures. This has hastened the consumers shift from Unorganised to Organised players. Futhermore, the Changes in the Consumer Preference towards designer and branded jewellery are encouraging signs. The Company believes that the Indian retail market offers a huge opportunity.

REGULATORY ENVIRONMENT AND ITS IMPACT ON BUSINESS AND INDUSTRY:

The Goods and Services Tax (GST) is a landmark reform having a lasting impact on the economy and on businesses. Your Company has successfully implemented and migrated to GST with effect from July 01, 2017 and changes across IT systems, supply chain and operations have been made keeping in mind the sweeping changes that GST has brought in. The GST which replaced the traditional taxation structure in July 2017 has led to an increase in the formalisation of economy and has made a huge impact on the unorganized players in this sector also and has helped the organized players to grow and increase their market share.

DIVIDEND:

In order to retain the surplus in business for further expansion and strengthening of financial base of the company, the directors have decided not to declare any dividend for the financial year ended 31st March 2018.

SHARE CAPITAL:

During the year under review, there is no change in Authorised Share Capital of the Company. Authorised share capital of the Company is Rs. 85,00,00,000.00 comprising 6,50,00,000 Equity Shares of Rs. 10/- each and 2,00,00,000 Preference Shares of Rs. 10/- each. Also there is no change in the Issued, Subscribed and Paid-up Share Capital of the company. Issued, Subscribed and Paid-up Share Capital of the Company is Rs. 74,97,50,000.00 comprising 6,49,75,000 Equity Shares of Rs. 10/- each and 1,00,00,000 Preference Shares of Rs. 10/- each.

During the year under review, the company has neither issued right shares, bonus shares, nor granted stock options nor sweat equity.

CHANGE IN CAPITAL STRUCTURE:

There is no change in the capital structure as compared to immediately preceding year.

GOODS AND SERVICES TAX (GST)

The Goods and Services Tax (GST) is a landmark reform having a lasting impact on the economy and on businesses. Your Company has successfully implemented and migrated to GST with effect from July 01, 2017 and changes across IT systems, supply chain and operations have been made keeping in mind the sweeping changes that GST has brought in.

INSURANCE

The assets of the Company are adequately insured against fire and such other risks, as are considered necessary by the Management.

DEPOSITS:

The Company has not accepted any deposits falling within the ambit of Section 73 of the Companies Act, 2013 and the Companies (Acceptance of Deposits) Rules, 2014.

EXTRACT OF ANNUAL RETURN:

The extract of Annual Return as required under section 92(3) of the Companies Act, 2013 and rule 12(1) of the Companies (Management and Administration) Rules, 2014, in Form MGT-9 is furnished in Annexure "A" and forms an integral part of this report.

MEETINGS OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS:

During the year Eleven Board Meetings were convened and held on 13.04.2017, 01.06.2017, 24.07.2017, 02.08.2017, 29.08.2017, 03.09.2017 (08.30 AM), 03.09.2017 (06.00 PM), 29.09.2017, 30.09.2017, 29.12.2017 and 27.03.2018. The intervening gap between the Meetings was within the period prescribed under the Companies Act, 2013.

DIRECTORS' RESPONSIBILITY STATEMENT:

Your Directors wish to inform Members that the Audited Accounts containing Financial Statements for the Financial Year 2017-18 are in conformity with the requirements of the Companies Act, 2013. They believe that the Financial Statements reflect fairly, the form and substance of transactions carried out during the year and reasonably present the Company's financial condition and results of operation.

In terms of provisions of Section 134(3)(c) of the Companies Act, 2013, your Directors further confirm as under:

- a. in preparation of the annual accounts, the applicable accounting standards have been followed along with proper explanation relating to material departures.
- b. the directors have selected such accounting policies and applied them consistently and made judgements and estimates that are reasonable and prudent so as to give a true and fair view, in the case of Balance Sheet, of the state of affairs of the Company as at 31st March 2018 and in the case of statement of Profit & Loss, of the Profit of the Company for the year ended on that date.
- c. the directors have taken proper and sufficient care for maintenance of adequate accounting records in accordance with the provisions of the Companies Act, 2013 for safeguarding the assets of the Company and for preventing and detecting fraud and other irregularities.
- d. the directors have prepared the annual accounts for the year ended 31st March 2018 on a going concern basis.
- e. The Company being unlisted, sub clause (e) of section 134(5) of the Companies Act, 2013 pertaining to laying down internal financial controls is not applicable to the Company.
- f. the directors have devised proper systems to ensure compliance with the provisions of all applicable laws and that such systems were adequate and operating effectively.

All the transactions with related parties are in the ordinary course of business and on arm's length basis. The details of the related party transactions as required under section 134(3) (h) of the Companies Act, 2013 in prescribed Form No. AOC-2, is furnished in Annexure "B" and forms an integral part of this report. There are no material significant related party transactions made by the Company with Promoters, Directors, Key Managerial Personnel or other designated persons and their relatives which may have a potential conflict with the interest of the Company at large. Suitable disclosure as required by the Accounting Standards (AS18) has been made in the notes to the Financial Statements. Your attention is drawn to the Related party disclosures set out in Note no 36 of the financial statements.

STATUORY AUDITORS:

Pursuant to the provisions of Section 139 of Companies Act, 2013 and the rules framed there under, M/s VKG & Company, Chartered Accountants (FRN 014547C), Jaipur were appointed as the Statutory Auditors of the Company in the Annual General Meeting(AGM) held on 27th September, 2014 for the term of five consecutive years, subject to ratification by members at every AGM during the said block of five years under the provisions of Companies Act, 2013. M/s VKG & Company (Firm Registration No. 014547C) Chartered Accountant, Jaipur will hold office till the conclusion of the Annual General Meeting to be held in the calendar year 2019 and are eligible for re-appointment.

The Company has received a letter from M/s VKG & Company, to the effect that their re-appointment, if made, would be within the prescribed limits under Section 141 of the Companies act, 2013 and that they are not disqualified for reappointment and are eligible for appointment. Accordingly the Board of Directors recommend ratification of appointment of M/s VKG & Company (Firm Registration No. 014547C) Chartered Accountant, Jaipur to hold office from the conclusion of this Annual General Meeting till the conclusion of the Annual General Meeting to be held in the calendar year 2019.

Further, there was no fraud in the Company, which was required to be reported by the statutory auditors of the Company under sub-section (12) of Section 143 of Companies Act, 2013.

STATUTORY AUDITORS' REPORT:

There is no reservation, qualification or adverse remark contained in the Statutory Auditors' Report attached to Balance Sheet as at 31st March 2018. Information referred in Auditors' Report are self-explanatory and don't call for any further comments.

SECRETARIAL AUDITOR:

As per the provisions of Section 204 of the Companies Act 2013 and the Companies (Appointment and Remuneration of Managerial Personnel) Rules, 2014, company is required to annex with its Board's Report, a Secretarial Annual Report given by a Company Secretary in practice. In line with this requirement, the Board of Directors has appointed Ms. Neha Khunteta (Membership no. 26433, CP No. 9634), Practicing Company Secretary, Jaipur as Secretarial Auditor of the Company for the financial year 2017-2018. The Secretarial Audit Report in form MR-3 is attached herewith as Annexure C which forms part of the Directors Report.

The report does not contain any reservation, qualification or adverse remark. Information referred to in the Secretarial Auditor Report are self-explanatory and do not call for any further comments.

INTERNAL AUDITOR:

In terms of Section 138 of the Companies Act, 2013 read with the Companies (Accounts) Rules, 2014, the Company has reappointed Mr. Shyam Krishan Gupta (Membership no. 405879), Chartered Accountant as the Internal Auditor of the Company for financial year 2017-2018.

COST AUDITOR:

Pursuant to Cost Record & Audit Rules, 2014 notified on 31st December, 2014, the products manufactured by the Company are not covered in Cost Audit. Hence, the requirement of cost audit is not applicable to the Company.

TRANSFER TO RESERVES :

The Company has not proposed any amount to be transferred to any reserves during the financial year ended 31st March 2018.

RISK MANAGEMENT POLICY:

Although the Company has long been followed the principle of risk minimization as is the norm in every industry, it has now become a compulsion. Therefore, the Board of Members were informed about the risk assessment and minimization procedures after which the Board formally adopted step for framing, implementing and monitoring the risk management plan for the company. The main objects is to ensure sustainable business growth with stability and to promote a proactive approach in reporting evaluating and resolving risk associated with the business. In order to achieve with the key objectives, the Company adopts a structured and disciplined approach to Risk management, in order to guide decisions on risk related issues.

In today's challenging and competitive environment strategies for mitigating inherent risk in accomplishing the growth plans of the company are imperative. The common risk inter-alia are Regulations, Competitive Business risk, Technology obsolescence, Investments, Retention of talent and Expansion of facilities.

In accordance with the provisions of Sections 196, 197, 198 and 203 read with Schedule V of the Companies Act, 2013, Mr. Sanjay Chhabra is appointed as Vice-Chairman & Managing Director of the Company, for a period of 3 (Three) years with effect from 01st July, 2014 to 30th June, 2017 and is not liable to retire by rotation under the provisions of the Act.

Your company in its extra ordinary general meeting held on 30th June 2017 has reappointed Mr. Sandeep Chhabra as Chairman & Managing Director of the Company, for a period of 3 (Three) years with effect from 01st July, 2017 to 30th June, 2020 not liable to retire by rotation and Mr. Sanjay Chhabra as Vice-Chairman & Managing Director of the Company, for a period of 3 (Three) years with effect from 01st July, 2017 to 30th June, 2020 not liable to retire by rotation. During the period under review, Mrs. Vimla Devi Jain (DIN: 00205827) ceased as director from the Board due to death on 12th March 2018. The Board of Directors placed on record their appreciations for the valuable contribution made by Mrs. Vimla Devi Jain during her tenure as director of the company.

BOARD EVALUATION:

Pursuant to the provisions of the Companies Act, 2013 the Board has carried out an annual performance evalution of its own performance, of all Director's individually, as well as the evalution of the working of its Audit Committee and Nomination & Remuneration Committee of the Board. Company Overview :-

Motisons Jewellers Limited is a limited company incorporated under the Companies Act, 1956 on 09.05.2011 having Corporate Identity No. U36911RJ2011PLC035122. The company registered under part IX of the Companies Act, 1956 by acquiring by operations of law business of partnership firm M/s Motisons Jewellers. The Company is engaged in the business of Manufacturing & Trading of Bullion, Jewellry, Sarafa, Precious & Semi Precious Stones. The company is doing business from showroon situated at Johari Bazar, Jaipur and Tonk Road, Jaipur. The company is having a factory in SEZ, Sitapura, Jaipur.

NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31ST MARCH 2018

Note (1) Significant Accounting Policies for the year ended on 31st March-2018

1. Basis of Accounting :-

The financial statements are prepared under historical cost convention on accrual basis of accounting in accordance with the generally accepted accounting principles and the provisions of the Companies Act, 2013. All income & expenditure items having a material bearing on the financial statements are recognized on accrual basis. The expense related to bonus and Leave Salary & Gratuity is accounted for on receipt/payment basis.

2. Use of Estimates :-

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and the disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities on the date of the financial statements and the sults of operations during the reporting periods. Although these estimates are based upon management's best knowledge of current events and actions, actual results could differ from those estimates and revisions, if any, are recognized in the current and future periods.

3. Value of Inventory :-

- (i) Raw materials: Cost comprise of expenditure incurred in normal course of business in bringing such inventories to its location and includes, where applicable, appropriate overhead including storage cost.
- (ii) Finished goods: Lower of cost or net realizable value.
- (iii) Inventories have been valued in accordance with Accounting Standard on valuation of Inventories (AS-2) issued by the institute of Chartered Accountants of India.
- (iv) Inventory Valued on above basis is certified by the management. The cost has been determined using average cost method of valuation of closing stock.

4. Property, Plant and Equipment :-

- (i) Property, plant and equipment is stated at cost, net of accumulated depreciation and accumulated impairment losses, if any. These tangible assets are held for use in production, supply of goods or services or for administrative purposes.
- (ii) Cost comprises of purchase cost, freight, duties, taxes and other expenses directly incidental to acquisition, bringing the asset to the location and installation including site restoration up to the time when the asset is ready for intended use. Such costs also include borrowing cost if the recognition criteria are met.
- (iii) Depreciation on property, plant and equipment is provided over the useful lives of assets as specified in Schedule II to the Act except where the Management, has estimated useful life of an asset supported by the technical assessment, external or internal i.e., higher or lower from the indicative useful life given under Schedule II. The Management believes that these estimated useful lives are realistic and reflect fair approximation of the period over which the assets are likely to be used.

(iv) Depreciation is calculated on a written value value basis over the estimated useful lives of the assets as follows:

Any gain or loss on disposal of investment properties is recognized in Statement of Profit and Loss

- (v) The Company is constructing a new showroom at Guatam Marg, Vaishali Nagar, Jaipur which is under-construction at the reporting date. During the year under consideration no depreciation were charged over of assets purchased for Showroom at Vaishali Nagar, Jaipur as same were not put to use at the reporting date.
- (vi) The residual value of assets has been calculated on original cost of assets. The software being intangible in nature are amortized on pro-rata basis using Written Down Va^{\dagger} to Method over the useful life estimated by the management which is three years.
- (vii) The title paper of Motor Car is mortgaged with the ICICI Bank. The total outstanding balance of bank loan as on 31/03/2018 is Rs.1,29,82,878.60 and charge is created over the assets of the company of Rs. 2,29,00,000.

5. Revenue Recognition :-

Revenue is recognized only when it can be reliably measured and it is reasonable to expect ultimate collection. The revenue recognized on accrual basis. Interest income is recognized on time proportion basis taking into account the amount outstanding and rate applicable.

6 Effects of Change in Foreign Exchange Rates

All the transaction denominated in foreign currencies are translated at the rate of exchange on the day the transaction occurs. Assets and Liabilities denominated in foreign currencies are translated at the exchange rate ruling on the Balance Sheet reporting Date. The exchange rate differences arising on foreign currency transactions are included in the Statement of Profit & Loss A/c.

7 Accounting for Investments

Investments are classified as long term and current investments. Long-term investments are stated at cost. Declined in value of long term investments is recognized if it is not temporary. Current investments are carried at lower of cost and fair value.

8. Employee Benefits :-

Employee Benefits such as PF, Family Pension, ESI etc are treated as defined contribution plan and contributions are charged to Statement of Profit & Loss when contributions to the respective funds are due. The company has taken a policy for arrangement of gratuity payment and the same accounted for on payment basis which not done as acturial valuation and not in accordance with AS -15.

9. Borrowing Costs:-

Borrowing costs that are attributable to acquisition or construction of qualifying assets are capitalized as part of cost of such asset. A qualifying asset is one that necessarily takes substantial period of time to get ready for its intended use. All other borrowing costs are charged to Revenue.

10. Lease Commitments:-

The company is running its business operations from rented premises at various locations where the lessors have effectively retained substantially all risk & benefits of ownership. Further the company also taken a house on lease which is provided to directors as rent free accomodation. These arrangements are thus in the nature of operating lease. These operating lease payments are recognised as an expenses in the statement of profit & loss on a straight line basis over the lease term. The lease rentals are recognised in the name of 'Rent' and 'House rent directors' in the financial statements.

11. Earning per share :-

- (i) Basic earning per share are calculated by dividing the net profit or loss for the period attributable to equity shareholders by weighted average number of equity share outstanding during the period.
- (ii) For the purpose of calculating diluted per earning per share, the net profit or loss for the period attributable to equity share holders and weighted average number of share outstanding during the period are adjusted for the effects of all dilutive potential equity share.

12. Accounting For Taxes On Income :-

Income Tax expense comprises current tax, and deferred tax charge or credit. Current tax is provided by the income tax payable by company as per provision of Income Tax Act, 1961. Deferred Tax is recognized on timing differences between the accounting income and taxable Income for the year and quantified using the tax rates and Laws enacted or substantively enacted as on the Balance Sheet date. Deferred tax assets are recognized and carried forward to the extent that there is reasonable certainty that the sufficient future taxable income will be available against which such deferred tax assets can be realized. The deferred Tax assets reviewed for the appropriation of their respective carrying values at the each balance sheet date.

13 Intangible Assets :-

The intangible assets being goodwill, trademark, software and website are recognized in the books of accounts at cost incurred in their acquisition. The software being intangible in nature are amortized on pro-rata basis using Written Down Value Method over the useful life estimated by the management which is three years. During the year no amortization has been made on trademark, goodwill & website.

4. Impairment of Assets :-

The carrying amounts of assets are revised at each balance sheet date if there is any indication of impairment based on internal/external factors. An asset is impaired when the carrying amount of the assets exceeds the recoverable amount. An impairment loss is charged to profit and loss account in the year in which an asset is identified as impaired. An impairment loss is recognized in prior accounting period is reversed if there has been change in the estimate of the recoverable amount. During the year under consideration there was no indication, either internal or external as to the impairment of the assets.

15. Provisions, Contingent Liabilities and Contingent Assets:-

- (i) Contingent Liabilities: Depending upon the facts of each case and after due evaluation of legal aspects, claims against the Company not acknowledged as debts are treated as contingent liabilities.
- (ii)Provisions: Provisions are recognized when the company has a present obligation as a result of past events, for which it is probable that an outflow of resources embodying economic benefits will be required to settle the obligation, and a reliable estimate of the amount can be made. Provisions required to settle are reviewed regularly and are adjusted where necessary to reflect the current best estimate of the obligation. Where the company expects provisions to be reimbursed, is recognized as a separate asset, only when such reimbursement is virtually certain.

16. Cash and Cash equivalents:-

Cash and cash equilantants for the purpose of cash flow statement comprise cash at bank and cash in hand and short term investments with an original maturity of three months or less.

17. General :-

Except wherever stated accounting policies are consistent with the generally accepted accounting principles and have been consistently applied.
